#### A Message From Pastor Beverly: The Jewish Festival of Purim

This last week's lesson was from the book of Esther, a book that is seldom in the lectionary. Its about the Jewish festival of Purim and how a young Hebrew woman by the name of Esther saved her people from complete genocide.

It happened in the 4<sup>th</sup> century when the Persian Empire was the most powerful kingdom at that time. King Ahasuerus, King of Persia, had his wife, Queen Vashti, executed for failing to follow his order. He decided to have a beauty pageant to find a new queen and wife. A Jewish girl named Esther, caught his eye and she became his new queen, but she did not tell the king she was Jewish.

Meanwhile, Haman was appointed prime minister, and it wasn't long before Mordechai, the leader of the Jews (and Esther's cousin), refused to bow to Haman. Haman was furious and convinced the king to issue a decree ordering the extermination of all the Jews on the 13th day of Adar.

When Esther heard what Haman had done, she put together a plan. She invited the King and Haman to join her for a feast. At the feast Esther revealed to the king that she was Jewish and that if his decree to kill all the Jews was carried out, she would also die

The king became incensed at Haman for his plot to kill all the Jews, including his wife. Haman was subsequently hanged, and Mordechai was appointed prime minister. Thus, a new degree went out saving all the Jews. So, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Adar or March, the Jewish people celebrate their salvation.

# Recipe of the Month: Pumpkin Pie Energy Balls

We had these for coffee hour in September and they were well received. You can buy this treat at Bassett's Market for about \$16, or you can make them at home for less. Ingredients: -½ cup pitted dates -½ cup walnuts

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup canned pumpkin
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup maple syrup
- -2 tsp pumpkin pie spice

-  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups quick oats

1. Place dates, walnuts, canned pumpkin, and maple syrup in a food processer and blend until almost smooth (i.e. some chunks remain). 2. Remove from food processer to a bowl. 3. Add pie spice and quick oats and stir until combined. 4. Roll into balls the size of a tablespoon, and place on a sheet of wax paper. Refrigerate at least three hours before serving. Enjoy.



#### Introducing Henrietta Stockdale: founder of professional nursing in South Africa, October 6<sup>th</sup>

Henrietta Stockdale was born on July 9th in 1847 in Nottinghamshire England. The daughter of a minister, Henrietta met many influential church leaders while she was growing up.

She became interested in mission work in 1863, when she met Edward Twells, Bishop of the Orange River Mission, South Africa. Soon after this meeting, she became a member of the Anglican Mission, in Stockdale. Later, she joined the Covenant Community of St. John the Baptist, where she trained as a nurse in preparation for her work as a missionary.

Her work began in 1874, when she joined the order of St. Michael of the Angels, a newly established Anglican community in South Africa. Later, she was assigned to the position of hospital administrator during the Boer War.

After further training at the University College, London, she returned to South Africa to help establish a school for nurses at Carnarvon Hospital in Kimberly. While working at the training institute, she was instrumental in establishing the first professional standards for nurses in South Africa. Her accomplishments are commemorated on October 6<sup>th</sup> in the Episcopal Calendar of Saints, the day of her death in 1911.
