A Message From Pastor Beverly from the book of Job

Our Old Testament Lesson for the first 4 Sundays in October was about a man named Job. He was devoted to God and had everything he could wish for but then through a bet between God and Satan he lost everything. But regardless of all the tragic things that happened to him, he never lost his faith in God.

Divine justice is one of the things that the book of Job deals with, "why do the righteous suffer"? The ancient Israelites believed that God rewarded the righteous and punished the sinner. Some people still believe that today, but the story of Job demonstrates that suffering is frequently unmerited.

As one of the oldest books in the Bible and patterned after an ancient Folktale, its real significance lies in how God reveals himself personally to Job, and how Job feels free to question and respond to God. A personal God for Job is also a personal God for us.

Treasury Report:

Pastor's Report (Bishop's Visit):

Pastor Beverly reported that she made several edits to the service before Bishop Hollinsworth's visit. The vestry agreed to donate \$200 or all the loose plate offering to the bishops discretionary fund, whichever was greater.

Recipe of the Month: Easy Pecan Bars

Ingredients:
Crust:
-3/4 cup butter at room temperature
-1/3 cup granulated sugar
1 ³ / ₄ cup flour
Filling:
-2/3 cup light brown sugar
-1 ¹ / ₂ cups corn syrup
-1 Tbsp Vanilla extract
-1/3 cup flour
-1 tsp kosher salt

 $-1\frac{1}{2}$ cups coarsely chopped pecans

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9X13 inch baking dish with foil and set aside. Cream butter and sugar. Add flour and mix till combined. Press mixture in the bottom of pan. Bake for 18-20 minutes. While crust is baking, whisk together brown sugar, eggs, corn syrup and vanilla. Add flour and salt and whisk till combine. Fold in pecans. Remove crust from oven and immediately and pour filling over crust. Bake 30-35 minutes until center is set. Cool completely before cutting. Store in refrigerator (*Source:Cookiesandcups.com*).



Commemoration of the Faithfully Departed: November 2nd

All Souls Day or the Commemoration of the Faithfully Departed is a day of prayer and remembrance for departed loved ones celebrated on November 2nd in many Christian traditions including the Catholic, Eastern Orthodox and Episcopal Churches. The date was standardized by Saint Odlio of Cluny back in the 10th century. Prior to that, it was observed on various dates around Eastertide, such as the Friday before Lent.

Several Catholic and Eastern traditions are associated with All Souls Day including the tolling of bells meant to offer comfort souls locker in purgatory, the lighting of candles, thought to bring light to those languishing in darkness and the giving of "soul" cakes, a tradition that likely evolve into the tradition of trick-or-treating.

However, in the Anglican communion, All Souls day serves as an extension of All Saints Day celebrated on November 1st as a commemoration of the faithfully departed. The prayers associated with this day are intended to remind us that we are "joined with communion of saints, that great group of Christians, who have finished their earthly life and with whom we have hope of the resurrection."
