A Message From Pastor Beverly

You may wonder why we have switched from purple to blue paraments, vestments and candles for Advent. Since Advent is a season of hope and anticipation, blue is now a more appropriate color. Blue is also the color associated with Mary, the mother of Christ.

Advent and Lent are both times of prayer and meditation, but Advent differs from Lent because Lent focuses on forgiveness and repentance while Advent is about expectation and joy. Purple is the color of sorrow and suffering, a color of mourning.

The candles on the Advent wreath symbolize hope, love, joy and peace. We light the first two blue candles to give us hope and love for the coming of the Messiah. The third candle, pink or rose, represents the joy at Christ anticipated birth. The final blue candle represents the peace Christ will bring into the world.

We light the center white candle, called the Christ Candle, on Christmas Eve to remind us of the light Christ will bring into the world.

Here is a summary of the minutes taken at the most recent vestry meeting on November 17, 2021.

Treasure's Report:

Contributions are up, but below budget expectations. This is related to capital improvements concerning the bell project. Due to a decision to sell select stock, realized gains reach above budget expectations. Investments continue to grow due to favorable market conditions.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Beverly has been attending meetings with NCMAC and the ministerial association and visiting a parishioner in the hospital during surgery. She also hosted a Lion's Club meeting in Guild Hall. The Catawba Island Garden Club also met here this month.

She explained that Christmas Eve Service will be held at 6:00 PM with Carson playing Christmas music for 30 minutes prior to that.

New Business:

Recipe of the month: Better Green Bean Casserole

Ingredients:

-3 cans French cut green beans, drained

-1 small can of French-fried onions

-8 oz of cheddar cheese, divided

-1 small container of sour cream

-1 ½ Tbsp butter, melted

-1 ½ Tbsp flour

-1 Tbsp sugar

-salt and pepper to taste

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. 2. Melt butter in sauce pan. Add flour and stir for about one minute to form a roux. 3. Add green beans, sour cream, sugar, 2/3 (6 oz) of the cheese, 2/3 of the onions, salt and pepper and mix well. 4. Pour into greased casserole dish. Bake for 30 minutes. 5. Remove from oven. Top with remaining chesses and onions. 6. Bake an additional 8-10 minutes until the onions are brown crisp and the cheese is bubbling. 7. Remove from oven and serve hot. *Contributor: Debby Barnes*

Holy Days: December 2021

December marks the beginning of the church calendar. The *Book of Common Prayer* (p.15-18) describes a variety of holy days celebrated throughout the year. These days include principal feasts, holy days, major and lesser feasts, fasts, and days of special devotion. They are intended to help Christians remember and learn about saints and other notable people throughout the history of the church.

There are many holy days celebrated in the month of December, the most notable of which is Christmas day also known as *The Nativity of our Lord*. Christmas is celebrated by 2 billion people in nearly 160 countries throughout the world. Billions of people gather together to commemorate the birth of Jesus.

Other holy days in the month of December include The feast of St. Stephen, (December 26th), who was stoned to death in Jerusalem by Saul of Tarsus for challenging Jewish authorities (Acts 7). Also, the feast of St. John, the Evangelist is celebrated on December 27th. The final gospel book is attributed to this John. Finally, we remember the holy innocents on December 28th, baby boys ordered killed by Herod, King of Judea in an attempt to prevent one of them from taking his throne (Matthew 2).

The *Book of Common Prayer* (p. 17) also describes days of optional observance. One such day for the member of this church would be the feast of our namesake, St. Thomas celebrated on December 21st. Thomas was one of the original twelve disciples of Jesus, the one who could not believe until he touched Jesus' side and was thought to have carried the gospel as far as India.
