This is a Psalm that needs to be prayed when life does not seem to make sense.

PSALM 91:1-6, 10-16

You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, will say to the LORD, 'My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust.' For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence; he will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; His faithfulness is a shield and buckler. You will not fear the terror of the night, or the arrow that flies by day, or the pestilence that stalks in darkness, or the destruction that wastes at noonday. Because you have made the LORD your refuge, the Most High your dwelling-place, no evil shall befall you, no scourge come near your tent. Fabulous February

February 1st 1960 – Sixteen minutes before it was scheduled to land, the space shuttle Columbia broke apart in flight over west Texas, killing all 7 crew.

February 2nd 1848 – The war between the U.S and Mexico ended with the signing of the Treat of Guadalupe Hidalgo.

February 6th 1799 – Massachusetts became the 6th state to ratify the new U.S Constitution, by a vote of 187 to 168.

February 8th 1910 – The Boy Scouts of America was founded by William Boyce in Washington, D.C., modeled after the British Boy Scouts.


February 10th 1942 - The first Medal of Honor during WW2 was awarded to 2nd Lt. Alexander Niniger (posthumously) for heroism during the Battle of Batann.

February 11th 1990 – Nelson Mandela, at age 71, was released from prison after serving 27 years of a life sentence.

February 14th 1889 – Photographer Mathew Brady took the first photograph of a U.S. President in office, James Polk.

February 17th – During the American Civil War, Fort Sumter in South Carolina was returned to the Union after nearly a year and a half under Confederate control. The fort had been the scene of the first shots of the war.

February 20th 1962 – Astronaut John Glenn became the first American launched into orbit, traveling aboard the "Friendship 7" spacecraft.



February 24th 1867 – The House of Representatives voted to impeach President Andrew Johnson. The effort to remove him failed in the Senate by just one vote.

February 27th 1991 – In Desert Storm, the 100 hour ground war ended as Allied troops entered Kuwait just 4 days after launching their offensive against Saddam Hussein's Iraqi forces.

February 28th 1844 – One of the guns aboard the USS Princeton exploded, killing several top U.S. government officials and narrowly missed killing President John Tyler.

Ingredients: 1/2tsp Paprika 1/2tsp Italian Seasoning 2 6oz Boneless skinless chicken breasts (1/2 thick) 1 ½ tbsp. olive oil divided 1 med shallot (finely chopped) 2 cloves garlic (finely chopped) 1 tbsp. tomato paste ¼ cup dry white wine 1/2tsp chicken bouillon 2tbsp oil packed sun dried tomatoes (chopped) 2tbs cold cream cheese, cut into small pieces Salt & Pepper Baguette (for serving)

Directions:

- 1. In a small saucepan, stir together paprika, Italian seasoning and ¼tsp each of salt and pepper; sprinkle over chicken breasts on both sides.
- 2. Heat 1tbsp oil in large skillet on medium. Cook chicken until golden brown and mostly cooked through, 3-4 mins per side. Transfer to plate. Reduce heat to med-low. Add remaining ½ tbsp oil to skillet, add shallot and garlic, cook covered, stirring often, until tender 4-5 mins.
- 3. Add tomato paste and cook, stirring until deepened in color, 1-2 mins. Increase heat to med, add wine and cook, scraping bottom of pan until most of liquid evaporates.
- 4. In measuring cup, whisk bouillon with ½ cup water, then whisk into skillet along with sun dried tomatoes. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a gentle simmer. Whisk in cream cheese until fully incorporated, then add chicken and juices to skillet. Cover and cook until chicken is cooked through (1-2 mins). Sprinkle with parsley and serve with baguette.
