December Dispatch

December 1st, 1955 – Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, AL for refusing to give up her seat.

December 2nd, 1982 – The first permanent artificial heart was implanted in 61-year-old Barney C. Clark.

December 4th, 1791 – *The Observer*, now the oldest Sunday newspaper in the world, was first published in Britain.

December 6th, 1865 – The 13th Amendment to the U.S Constitution was ratified abolishing slavery.

December 7, 1941 - The U.S. Naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, was attacked by nearly 200 Japanese aircraft in a raid that lasted just over one hour and left nearly 3,000 Americans dead.

December 14, 1799 - George Washington died at Mount Vernon.

December 19, 1732 - Benjamin Franklin first published *Poor Richard's Almanac* containing weather predictions, humor, proverbs and epigrams, eventually selling nearly 10,000 copies per year.

December 22, 1783 - Following a triumphant journey from New York to Annapolis, Maryland, George Washington, victorious Commander-in-Chief of the American Revolutionary Army, appeared before Congress and voluntarily resigned his commission.

December 23, 1888 - Dutch painter Vincent van Gogh cut off his left ear during a fit of depression.

December 25, 1868 - President Andrew Johnson granted general amnesty to all those involved in the Civil War.

December 31, 1879 - Thomas Edison provided the first public demonstration of his electric incandescent lamp at his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey.

Homemade Hot Apple Cider







- -6 cups apple cider 1/4 cup real maple syrup 2 cinnamon sticks
- 6 whole cloves 6 whole allspice berries
- -1 orange peel, cut into strips 1 lemon peel, cut into strips

Gather the ingredients. Pour apple cider and maple syrup into a large stainless-steel saucepan. Place cinnamon sticks, cloves, allspice berries, orange peel, and lemon peel in the center of a square of washed cheesecloth; fold up the sides of the cheesecloth to enclose the bundle, then tie it up with a length of kitchen string. Drop the spice bundle into the cider mixture. Place the saucepan over moderate heat and cook until cider is very hot but not boiling, about 5 to 10 minutes. Remove cider from the heat. Discard the spice bundle. Ladle cider into big cups or mugs, adding a fresh cinnamon stick to each serving if desired.
